Health Requirements

- Current Yearly Vaccinations on File:
Rabies, Distemper/Parvo, Bordetella
- Must be spayed/neutered by 6-9 months
- No female dogs allowed in heat
- If your dog shows any signs of sickness, coughing, limping, eye discharge, unusually loose stool/diarrhea, etc., your dog should stay home
- After spaying/neutering, dogs should wait 10-14 days before returning to daycare

Daycare

- We are an indoor/outdoor facility in all types of weather so your dog may get wet or dirty
- Doggy jackets/sweaters should fit snugly - be aware that it may get torn
- Lunch/snacks should be clearly marked with your dog's name written on the container

What to Bring for Boarding

- Food for your dog's stay with name & feeding instructions clearly written on the container
- Any Medication your pet needs with instructions clearly marked on the container
- Blankets are provided, but feel free to bring a bed from home
- Sanitized bowls are provided

Things to Keep in Mind

Dogs, like people, can get sick. If there is a bug going around, the likelihood of your pet contracting it goes up based on their exposure to more animals. Although we disinfect our facility daily, we cannot guarantee that your pet will not catch a bug. If we notice that your pet is not feeling well, we will notify you immediately. Some dogs do not socialize well. If your pet shows aggression toward other dogs or humans, we cannot accept him or her at Paws for the safety of other dogs & humans. Play time can get a bit rough at times. Although we strive to provide a safe environment for your pet, there is always the possibility that he or she can sustain an injury during play time. This is simply a risk that is inherent in the play environment. You, as a pet owner, must accept the fact that although we supervise play time, there is always some risk of injury. We will obviously do everything we can to minimize this risk.
